A number of additional concepts and models, as well as some new scenarios, have been introduced throughout the text and the links to the Institute's Module (where relevant) have now been identified at the beginning of the chapters. The text is suitable for use on the Chartered Management Institutes Diploma Level course on Understanding Yourself and "Personal Development Planning". It is also suitable for NVQ national units of managerial competence and personal competency required to perform at management level 4.

Fashion in the Age of the Black Prince Dec 17 2021 A close study of clothes worn by aristocratic families and their households at the time of the Black Prince - and of Chaucer - showing Europe-wide influences. 1340 to 1363 were years remarkable for dramatic developments in fashion and for extravagant spending on costume, foreshadowing the later luxury of Richard II's court. Stella Mary Newton broke new ground with this detailed study, which discusses fourteenth-century costume in detail. She draws on surviving accounts from the Royal courts, the evidence of chronicles and poetry (often from unpublished manuscripts), and representations in painting, sculpture and manuscript illumination. Her exploration of aspects of chivalry, particularly the choice of mottoes and devices worn at tournaments, and of the exchange of gifts of clothing between reigning monarchs, offers new insights into the social history of the times, and she has much to say that is relevant to the study of illuminated manuscripts of the fourteenth century. STELLA MARY NEWTON's lifelong interest in costume has been the mainspring of her work, from early days as a stage and costume designer (including designing the costumes for the first production of T.S. Eliot's *Murder in the Cathedral*) to her later work at the National Gallery advising on the implications of costume for the purpose of dating, and at the Courtauld Institute where she set up the department for the study of the history of dress.

Chic Shifter Feb 07 2021 Through the production of 'Chic Shifter,' a digital fashion journal with an "altered hem" I will explore elements of midwestern fashion culture, beginning with Chicago. Inspired by books such as 'Fear and Clothing' by fashion critic, Cintra Wilson, and 'Women in Clothes' by Sheila Heti, Heidi Julavits, and Leanne Shapton, Chic Shifter focuses on presenting the "skyline" of fashion within the Midwest. 'Chic Shifter' offers a fresh perspective, outside of centralized fashion cities and norms. Coinciding with the traditional fashion seasons of spring/summer and fall/winter, each season the publication presents a theme and offers related writing in four of its six sections: Considering, Seeing, Shopping, and Touring. The theme for the first spring/summer issue is "The Four R's: Reduce, Reuse, Revive, Risk". Today's fashion magazines and blogs are inundated with images. While I understand the necessity for images, I am interested in exploring a poetic and theoretical representation of dress in the section, Considering. Inspired by works from 'Fashion Theory: The Journal of Dress, Body and Culture,' 'WORN,' a Canadian fashion journal no longer in print, as well as writings by Roland Barthes, Jean Baudrillard, Georges Perec, and Georg Simmel, this section offers theoretical and creative bases for considering fashion. Through interviews with Chicago's emerging and established fashion designers, the section Seeing helps to assess the city's current fashion developments and future; introducing local designers.

The section, Shopping reviews Chicago-area boutiques and large retailers, and is directly inspired by Wilson's "Critical Shopper" column published in 'The New York Times,' 2008-11. Although 'Chic Shifter' is currently based out of Chicago, regular trips to other midwestern cities are covered in the section Touring, which includes reviews of fashion exhibits in the Midwest: Detroit, MI; Toledo and Kent, OH; and Indianapolis, IN. Street-style shots provide much needed documentation for defining Chicago's street style through its neighborhoods in the section Street highlighting four neighborhoods per issue. The section, Limiting requires community participation. Each issue imposes weekly sartorial limits on participants. During the month of April, for example, the limits included: changing silhouettes, wearing neutral colors, wearing only colors, and wearing 70% natural fibers. Participants submit photo documentation in addition to a brief summary of their experience. A sidebar section titled, Faux Pas, Faux Yeah allows for community participation as readers vote on a given illustrated fashion point as either a "faux pas" or "faux yeah." 'Chic Shifter' then presents its response and reasoning. Examples will include: the x-tack left on coats, stickers and tags not removed from sports caps, wearing white in all seasons, and wearing all black. The goal of this thesis research is to look at Chicago fashion critically while also educating myself and readers about the choices we have in fashion, in order to become aware of personal style and develop it beyond the confines of economy, trend, and comfort. 'Chic Shifter' will create a space for the Midwest within the larger scope of the fashion world at chicshifter.com.

E-Pedagogy for the Digital Age Sep 02 2020 Adult learners have more options for enrolling in postsecondary education than ever before, and they are able to use their learning style preference in deciding which program best meets their needs. For some of these students, those programs are fully online, and for others, there is minimal use of technology. As technology grows and become more integrated into individual lives, the unique learning styles and preferences of adults need to learn to be incorporated into instructional design. Drawing on a regional sample of US colleges, 545 adult learners in a graduate programs were surveyed about how to effectively build community in their online classes. Results indicated some agreement with these instructional tools. Mature adult learners, however, were found to have stronger agreement with strategies that included work outside of the formal online class. These results suggest perhaps a greater comfort for adults in working in spaces where there is less likelihood of being judged or graded, and that they might value relational work with other students in different ways than younger adults.

Winston Churchill famously instructed the head of the Special Operations Executive to "Set Europe ablaze!" Agents of both the British Special Operations Executive and the American Office of Strategic Services underwent rigorous training before making their way, undetected, into Occupied Europe. Working alone or in small cells, often cooperating with local resistance groups, agents undertook missions behind enemy lines involving sabotage, subversion, organizing resistance groups and intelligence-gathering. The SOE's notable successes included the destruction of a power station in France, the assassination of Himmler's deputy Reinhard Heyrich, and ending the Nazi atomic bomb program by destroying the heavy water plant at Vemork, Norway. Operation Valuable Fiend Nov 23 2019 Based on previously classified documents, the true account of a top-secret Cold War operation: the CIA's failed attempt to spark rebellion in Albania. In 1949, a newly minted branch of the CIA (the precursor of today's National Clandestine Service) hatched an elaborate plan to roll back the Iron Curtain: coordinate with the British Secret Intelligence Service to foment popular rebellion and detach Albania from Moscow's orbit. The operation resulted in dismal failure and was shut down by 1954. In Operation Valuable Fiend, Albert Lulushi gives the first full accounting of this CIA action, based on hundreds of declassified documents, memoirs, and recollections of key participants, including Albanian exiles recruited for missions and their Communist opponents. Up until now, the story of the operation has been obfuscated and even distorted. Some blamed the Soviet mole Kim Philby for sabotaging it; the communists credited the prowess of their secret police; and CIA memoirs were heavily sanitized. Lulushi lists a range of factors that led to the failure, from inexperienced CIA case officers outsmarted in spy-versus-spy games by their ruthless Stalinist opponents to rivalries between branches of the CIA, and between the agency and friendly intelligence services, as well as conflicts among anti-Communist factions that included Albania's colorful exiled leader, King Zog. This book also shows how this operation served as the proving ground for techniques used in later CIA Cold War paramilitary actions—involving some of the same agency operatives—including the coup d'états in Iran and Guatemala and the Bay of Pigs invasion of Cuba.
